
Recent Preservation of County Records - May 2014

A goal of the Yorktown Preservation Society is to continue the preservation of York County's records, some of the oldest in the state. Over the years, the APVA Yorktown Branch has restored close to 50 books of records that date from 1645 through the 1840's. YPS has continued that tradition by funding the restoration of Marriage Licenses 1866-1876. The restorations were completed in May with the help and support of Kristen Nelson, Deputy Clerk of Court. The records have been cleaned, repaired, and rehoused in black leather binding by C.W. Warthen, records preservation specialists.

The books are dedicated to Thomas Clark and Nancy Lee Clark who have been devoted officers and volunteers of the organization for many years.
